New Community Partnerships

New Horizons — The Orléans-Cumberland Community Resource Centre is a bilingual multiservice centre that promotes and contributes to the health and welfare of the Orléans-Cumberland residents.

The Centre plays an important role in offering a variety of services meeting the needs of our community. To achieve this, we actively seek out partnership opportunities that will complement the services we currently offer.

As part of the New Horizons program, we received a grant of \$ 24,000 to provide a mentoring program. This program will be offered in collaboration with le Rendez-vous des aînés francophones d'Ottawa and Employment Ontario. It will provide opportunities for seniors to mentor unemployed individuals. They will do this by using expertise acquired within their respective profession in an effort to promote career advancement and prospects to the unemployed individuals.

About Sexual Health — We are developing a new partnership with Somerset west Community Health Centre and Eastern Ottawa Community Resource Centre, to provide more resources and information on sexual health for resident in the East end of Ottawa.

Soon we will have two monthly community clinics that will offer information about sexual health, distribute condoms, lube, and other resources. These clinics will also offer anonymous rapid HIV testing, confidential syphilis testing, and collect urine samples for chlamydia and gonorrhea testing.

We are very happy to welcome this new program. Over the next few months, we will consult with community members to gain a better understand their needs. The east end definitely needs more resources and information about sexual health.

EBO will deliver three different component included in the Financial Empowerment and Problem Solving (FEPS); Individual Problem Solving, Financial Literacy Workshops and Tax Clinics. The Orléans-Cumberland Community Resource Centre has benefitted from EBO Financial Education Centre capacity and expertise on many occasions, having referred many individuals to them for individual budget counselling sessions and group workshops. Their approach, customized to each client's reality, and their genuine compassion and commitment are evident in every interaction they have with our residents as well as with their own.

My volunteer work at the Orléans-Cumberland Food Bank

What motivates you to be a volunteer in this organization?

"I moved to Ottawa 5 years ago and wanted to get involved in the community. I have always been a supporter of food banks during my working life, so I contacted the CRC to ask about the potential of volunteering."

What is your role at the Food Bank?

"My role has expanded since I started with the food bank almost 4 years ago. Although I still work sorting food and assisting families on the actual days the food bank is open to the public, I now have been trained to use our new data base. I take information from families new to the food bank as well as register visits from individuals and families who use the service on a regular basis. I feel I have the best of both worlds - one-to-one with families and group interaction with volunteers and staff members."

What do you like most about your volunteer work?

"There are many things about the service that I like. Food banks offer a concrete way to assist families in need. Our food bank is well organized and recipients are treated with respect and given support when needed. Staff members and volunteers are friendly and positive about the food bank."

"I appreciate the international flavour of our food bank. This was a surprise to me initially. I get a glimpse at how services are organized in our community and the kinds of supports available for persons who need them."

Market Mobile Ottawa

Fresh and affordable food rolling into a community near you!

Ottawa's Poverty and Hunger Working Group had a dream of creating a mobile market that would bring healthy, affordable, and culturally appropriate foods to Ottawa neighbourhoods. The grocery-store on wheels became known as the MarketMobile.

The project is led by the Poverty and Hunger Working Group, in collaboration with multiple public, private and community partners including: Rideau-Rockcliffe Community Resource Centre, Ottawa Public Health, Ottawa Community Housing, Loblaws, Cibo Food, Coalition of Community Health and Resource Centres, Ottawa Poverty Reduction Network, Community Development Framework and countless engaged and passionate community members.



The MarketMobile operates two days per week at 7 different locations, year-round, with a truck and retrofitted trailer.

It carries a selection of over 30 different items each week based on the requests of individuals in the communities it visits. The prices are kept low by purchasing food items in bulk and selling them not-for-profit (on average, 40% less than in retail grocery stores).
